#### Section 21: Rules and Guidelines

21.1 To assist in the administration of this Act, the Minister may, at any time and from time to time, prescribe rules, regulations and guidelines for any purpose of the Act, including, without limitation, describing the steps that parties may take with regard to compliance with the provisions of this Act, the manner in which the Minister may exercise his or her discretion under any provision of this Act, the criteria, conditions and procedures upon the basis of which licenses may be issued under this Act and the terms and conditions which may be imposed in respect of any licenses, or regarding any other matter pertaining to the administration of this Act.

#### Section 22: Tribunal

- 22.1 The Tribunal shall be composed of five (5) persons who shall be appointed by the Minister from time to time. Appointees to the Tribunal may be representatives of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and of such other ministries, departments or agencies of the Government of Liberia, or of the private sector, as the Minister in his or her discretion determines.
- 222 Members of the Tribunal shall serve for a term of five (5) years but their appointments may be renewed for a further term or terms at the discretion of the Minister.

#### Section 23: Appeals

- 23.1 A person whose right to engage in Foreign Trade is affected by any determination or decision made by the Minister pursuant to this Act has a right to appeal in accordance with this section 23.
- Without limiting the generality of section 23.1, a right of appeal exists in respect of a decision to establish a Restrictive Measure under section 5.1, a decision to impose or levy fees under section 7.1, a decision to impose Quantitative Restrictions under sections 15.1 or 15.2, a decision to grant quotas in respect of the import or export of certain goods pursuant to section 16.2, a decision to revoke a quota under section 16.6, a decision to require a license to import or export certain goods under section 17.1, a decision not to issue a particular license under section 19.4, and a decision to cancel any license pursuant to section 19.8.
- A person may appeal to the Tribunal any decision or determination made by the Minister under this Act that affects his or her right to engage in Foreign Trade. To do so, an affected person must file a notice of appeal in a form prescribed by the Tribunal within 30 days of the date of the decision or determination in question.
- 23.4 Upon receipt of a valid notice of appeal, the Tribunal shall fix a date for a hearing of the appeal. At the hearing, the affected person and his or her counsel may attend in person and may make oral or written submissions to the Tribunal, may examine and cross-examine witnesses under oath, and may produce documents.
- 235 The Tribunal shall prescribe its own rules of procedure, provided however that such rules shall ensure that the affected person is guaranteed due process and a fair hearing, including the right to be represented by counsel. The rules of procedure shall be published in accordance with the provisions of section 6.

- The Tribunal shall render its decision within a reasonable time after a hearing is held and shall provide written reasons for its decision.
- 237 Both the Minister and the affected person have the right to appeal any decision of the Tribunal to the Court. Any such appeal shall be instituted by filing a notice of appeal with the Court within 30 days of a decision of the Tribunal.
- 238 Upon the hearing of such an appeal, the Court may order any form of relief it considers necessary or appropriate in the circumstances, including, without limitation, specific performance or injunctive relief, on such terms and for such time periods as the Court considers necessary or advisable.

#### Section 24: Enforcement

24.1 Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this Act, any decision or determination made by the Minister under this Act, the terms and conditions of any quota or license granted or issued under this Act, or the terms and conditions of any Executive Order made under this Act is guilty of felony of the second degree and, upon conviction, is liable to a fine not exceeding US\$ 20,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two (2) years, or to both.

#### Section 25: Confidential Information

25.1 All information that is provided to the Minister, or any officer, employee' or agent thereof, pursuant to any provision of this Act on a confidential basis shall be treated as such and shall not be disclosed to any other person without the express consent of the person who provided the confidential information, except where disclosure is required by applicable law.

## Section 26: Electronic Filing and Issuance

26.1 Any application, notification, license, quota or other document the submission or issuance of which is required or provided for under this Act may be submitted or issued in the form of an electronic record, subject to such terms and conditions as the Minister may prescribe by regulation.
